

How to combat misinformation about migration?

- **Verify Information:**
 - Always double-check information before believing or sharing it on social media. Look for reliable sources and cross-reference information from multiple trustworthy outlets to ensure accuracy Refer to the migration app by MIDEQ (<https://pardesi.org.np>) and check for information on foreign employment Board.
- **Question Sources:**
 - Examine the sources of information. Be sceptical of information from unknown or unverified sources, and prioritize information from established and credible institutions.
- **Critical Thinking:**
 - Develop critical thinking skills by asking questions like: Does this information make sense? Are there any logical inconsistencies or biases in the content? How does this information compare to what I already know? Ask an expert, ask with an official person for migration.
- **Media Literacy:**
 - Learn to analyse media content critically. Understand how media organizations work, their potential biases, and how they fact-check and verify information. Be aware of sensationalism and clickbait.
- **Digital Citizenship:**
 - Practice responsible online behaviour. Be mindful of the content you share, and consider its potential impact. Report misinformation to appropriate platforms or authorities to help combat its spread.
